Taxpayers Report

The high point of this week's Commissioner Meeting was the contract awarded to a local contractor for the new heating and air conditioning systems in the jail building. This is the way our County work needs to be done. Always local, and this local contractor also saved the taxpayers of Sheridan County \$20,000.00!

I've been writing about unencumbered cash carryovers from one year to the next. We are now at the end of 2018 and Sheridan County will have a \$6.7 million cash-carryover into 2019, and don't forget that the 2019 Budget that was passed over the objections of the taxpayers increases taxes another \$400 thousand in 2019.

The most significant factor that shows how a county is doing economically, is school enrollment. How does the mill levy affect the ability of a town and community to attract young people, attract new businesses, and create new jobs? All of these activities are required if the school enrollment is going to be maintained, and certainly going to be required if our school enrollment is going to steadily increase.

The following report shows school enrollment and the mill levy in its corresponding town. It's easy to see that the high mill levies have resulted in decreasing school enrollments during the past ten years, as well as decreasing population. Why?? Because we are not an affordable town to live in. The property tax paid on a house in Hoxie is two to three times higher than a comparable house in the eastern part of rural Kansas. The same is true of our businesses in Hoxie; they are paying two to three times more than businesses in the rural eastern part of the state.

Take a look at the last entry in the table below: "Hoxie". We are the outstanding community in comparison to all the small towns in Northwest Kansas. Why? Because we are blessed with the Foote family making a huge investment in Sheridan County, as well as other counties in this area, and as a result, have created many new jobs and have attracted many new people to our town and community. Also, BTI John Deere has come to our community and built a new facility. Hoxie Implement has also expanded and added many new jobs. There are many positive things happening in our community but be very clear...these high tax rates will kill our local economy and we will decline in population and school enrollment. The good news is we have the opportunity to turn this around and get these taxes under control, so Hoxie and Sheridan County can continue to grow and prosper! We need to all work together and get this done.

AN INTERVIEW WITH ASTRONAUT JICK HAGUE

On Wednesday, December 12, Hoxie native, astronaut Nick Hague called The Sheridan Sentinel for a prescheduled interview.

Knowing that we would only have about 10-minutes for questions, we posted to our Facebook group asking what were some things that people would like to know. We were able to get the answers to most, but not all of them. Some were even answered in the earlier press conference, which gave us time to ask other questions.

Micalyn Scott wanted to know: "Does he still play the trombone? And if so, will he be taking it to space and playing it for the other astronauts to enjoy?!?!'

Nick laughed and replied, "Unfortunately, there's not enough room to take a trombone to space. They do have instruments onboard; a keyboard, a small saxophone, and a couple of small guitars. Unfortunately, I don't play any of those, so they will have to deal with my attempts to sing, which sound kind of like cats scratching on the glass. Anyway, so, no, I can't take one with me, but it has been fun to share; my oldest son has just started in band, he plays the clarinet, and getting him excited about band and music has been fun. It is sharing that experience I had going through high school and participating in music and how it helps you develop. It's been a lot of fun.'

Jaime Bufkin asked, "Could we send him a Hoxie Indians flag to take into space with him?? He could send it back when he is done, and we can

put it up at the school and display it!!"

When Rachel asked Nick this question, she said that this was from Jaime Bull, and Nick said, "Yep, I know Jaime! And, I do have the ability to take some things up with me, and I'm trying to coordinate that through the school. The Public Affairs people have been in touch with the high school counselor, as well as the Superintendent's office. We were trying to schedule an on-orbit event where I was going to talk to the ground, and then we were also looking at the potential for me to try to get out there after I fly."

Shirley Popp's question was, "How was growing up in Hoxie and among rural folk served him in his career?"

Nick said, appreciated growing up in a small town. I appreciate it now. When I was growing up in a small town, I just looked at all the things that I *didn't* have because we were so isolated. But, looking back now, I realize all the advantages that gave me. We were part of a small high school where I could play four different sports and be part of several different clubs, and do band, and do all these other things. When you start to get in large school systems you kind of have to pick and choose at a pretty early age, what is your interest, what do you want to do, and you lose out on all those other opportunities. Hoxie affords this. You can try so many different things, because there are so many opportunities. That opened my eyes at a really young age







Icy Desserts

The fact that ice and snow surround us does not deprive us of the taste for frozen dishes and the convenience of freezing water to make ice helps to make the dessert a very reasonable one. Put a pail or pan of water outside over night and have a block of ice for the freezing of the dessert.

Frozen Fig Custard - Beat the yolks of six eggs until well broken, add to a quart of rich milk and a cup of granulated sugar. Cook until the spoon is coated and set away to cool. When cold, flavor with lemon and add a cup of steamed, finely chopped figs. Then add a pint of whipped cream, the whites of the eggs beaten stiff and turn into the freezer. Open and stir the fruit that has settled to the bottom after it is half frozen.

Frozen Chocolate - Melt four

ounces of chocolate by putting into a pan over hot water, add one and a half cupfuls of granulated sugar and stir until

this is melted; then add a cupful of rich milk or thin cream and boil for one minute. Meanwhile, have a tablespoonful of gelatin melted in a quarter of a cupful of cold water, and when softened, add to the hot mixture. When cold add a teaspoonful of vanilla, a pinch of salt and three cupfuls of cream, whipped. Pour into a mold and pack in ice and salt.

Four parts of ice to one of salt.

Coffee Ice - Make a quart of strong, clear coffee, sweeten it with six tablespoonfuls of sugar, cool and partly freeze. When it is like frappe add the whites of two eggs, beaten stiff, and finish freezing. Serve in sherbet glasses with whipped sweetened cream on each glass.


The making of a savory, well-seasoned sauce, is an art. The commonest dishes, when dressed with an appropriate **Flavoring Spices -** Take a fourth of a pound of black

pepper, two ounces of ginger,

one ounce of grated nutmeg, the same of allspice, cinnamon and cloves, all ground, and a half pound of salt. Put these ingredients through a fine sieve several times, to be sure they are well mixed and blended, and keep closely covered to keep the salt dry. It is a good plan to thoroughly dry the salt before it is mixed with the other ingredients. Add in small quantities as needed to season

For the plain white sauce, which is so much used for fish, meat and vegetable sauces, prepare by melting two tablespoonfuls of butter, adding two tablespoonfuls of flour when the butter in bubbling hot, then when well mixed add a cup of rich milk. The sauce is varied by the amount of flour and butter, as well as the amount of liquid added.



I enjoyed every minute of the service, but it was pure torture to stay around and visit in front of the church afterwards. While attended church services, Santa dropped by our home.

I couldn't wait to run home and rip open packages. Like every other youngster, I counted the days. It seemed like Christmas would never

As a young child, I don't remember seeing Santa until I was four. That's about the time the jolly, old fat man dropped down our chimney with gifts galore.

While Santa was a big part of Christmas in our family,

parents grew up during the Great Depression. Anything that cost money was rare at Christmas. Gifts for mom and dad consisted of useful things like clothing and maybe one toy for each child - if crops and harvest had been bountiful. Ice cream and fresh oranges were always a special treat reserved for the celebration of the Christ child.

We were more fortunate in the gift department. Santa always came to our door toting a bulging burlap bag filled with toys. You see, the Schlageck children were very good little girls and boys - at least that's the way we pictured ourselves, especially before Christmas.

Probably my favorite gift was a "wind-up" toy train. I played for hours with that wonderful gift. If this wasn't heaven, it was the next best thing.

Until the mid-60s our family always celebrated Christmas with a real tree. Then plastic, artificial trees dominated the market. Unfortunately, we erected one too.

Mom decorated our house with brilliant red poinsettias. While she was decorating, she would tell us the legend of how the poor Mexican boy prayed to Christ for a gift he could give. As he arose from his knees a poinsettia plant grew at his feet. The boy broke off the branches and took the beautiful poinsettia to the altar.

Our dining room table was a celebration of food during the holiday season. Christmas dinner consisted of turkey, mashed potatoes and gravy, cranberries, freshbaked crescent rolls, green peas and a relish dish. For dessert, pumpkin pie and freshly whipped cream was the fare that completed the feast. That was our favorite, and my mother made the

Mom also made chocolate fudge with walnuts. I ate too many walnuts as a fiveyear-old, so I picked out the walnuts and ate only the fudge. Homemade peanut brittle was another specialty my mother made for us during Christmas.

As a youngster I had plenty to be thankful for during the holiday season. A wonderfully decorated home, the smell of baking turkey and the anticipation of Christmas are memories I will cherish forever.

This Christmas, like so many folks, we will celebrate Christmas with our family and friends. We celebrate Christmas in our home with traditions of our own.

Christmas is truly for children and those who love them. The joy we see in the eyes of a child will remain always in our hearts.

Remember during holiday season that springs from the heart of anyone dedicated to caring and helping others. The Christmas spirit dwells inside each of us.

This holiday season, say a prayer of peace for all, and worship the Christ child like many have for more than 2,000 years.

Research Fortifies the Holiday Meal: Meat the Future

As you sit down for holiday meals with family and friends - what are a few of the thoughts that have crossed your mind as you prepared the food you are eating? Will this recipe turn out? Will we have a ton of left overs? How much did I spend on this meal?

For many families, it's a pretty special time when the holiday ham is sliced, veggies are cooked, and the rolls are golden brown. Kansas State University agricultural economist Andrew Barkley notes that consumers may not realize there's probably a healthy helping of science on the holiday plate, as well.

Barkley, the Coffman Distinguished Teaching Scholar in the Department of Agricultural Economics, tracks the return on investment of agricultural research to local economies. What he often finds is that research leads to more efficient practices, which translates to less expensive food.

"For consumers, it means you're getting a good deal on the food you eat," Barkley said. "Agricultural research definitely has had a massive impact on lowering the cost of food over time, and it continues to lower the cost."

In Kansas, scientists help farmers grow more abundant wheat and other crops, healthier pork and beef, and safer dairy products. As one example, Barkley has determined that for every dollar spent on wheat research in Kansas, the state's economy gets a return of about \$10.

In other states, land-grant universities - established more than 150 years ago to improve the lives of Ameri- innovation labs at numerous can citizens – use research to help with various parts of the traditional holiday meal, such as turkeys in Arkansas, cranberries in Massachusetts and potatoes in Idaho.

"All of the agricultural research (done at U.S. universities) is really geared toward making our production agriculture more efficient, which is really making those food products available for less money," Barkley said. "That's one way to explain efficiency."

He noted that not too many years back, the cost of food took up most of a family's budget. But today, "less than 10 percent of our budget is spent on food."

"That 10 percent even includes all of our food away from home, including restaurants, and more expensive foods bought at specialty stores. If you make an effort to buy only affordable food, you could be well below 10 percent."

Each year, the American Farm Bureau Federation studies the average cost of the

By Jenilee Martin, Twin Thanksgiving meal. In its unique study, the group sends shoppers out to purchase the products in a tradition holiday meal.

Last month, the group noted that the cost of dinner was down for the third consecutive year: about \$48.90 for 10 people, or less than \$5 per person.

Spending less on food leaves a bit more for other holiday expenses, says Barkley: "It gives us more money to spend in helping others or for buying gifts for our family."

Barkley teaches a class at Kansas State University in which he tells students that when the United States was being settled, more than 90 percent of people were employed in jobs related to producing food.

"And now we're down to just a few hundred thousand people, well below 1 percent of our population," he said. "As a result of becoming more efficient in producing safe food, we are able to have people producing clothing and cars and cell phones and movies and footballs and running gear - all of that other stuff has become available, whereas a couple hundred years ago, all we had was food."

"It's all kind of tied together that the efficiency in agriculture allows people to produce other goods, and that increases our standard of living and that makes food more affordable. And not only is it more efficient and cheaper, but their incomes go up because they are doing other things."

The U.S. Agency for International Development helps to spread this impact across the world. Through its global food and hunger initiative, called Feed the Future, USAID funds appropriately-named

universities. Kansas State University has four such labs, the second most among U.S. universities, that address wheat and sorghum improvement, sustainable agriculture and post-harvest food loss.

"It's fair to say that the rest of the world is catching up because of our efforts to transfer technology," Barkley said. "So, really, the trend to produce safer, more plentiful and more affordable food is global and a lot of it is due to agriculturists at land-grant universities sharing their knowledge and expertise." 






Commission Minutes 12/10/2018

Now on this 10th day of December 2018, the Board of Commissioners, Sheridan County, Kansas met in regular session with Chairman Vic Bielser presiding. Others present were Joe Bainter, Troy Dewey and County Clerk Heather Bracht. Guests included Doren Follis, Wes Rachel Farber, Bainter. Viktorija Briggs and Gary Smith.

The meeting was called to order by Bielser.

Bracht presented corrected Memorandum of Agreement between Sheridan County Commissioners, Mickey Museum Property and Sheridan County Historical Society. This Agreement had been approved at the regular meeting on December 3 but in reviewing the documents, there were some errors. The Historical Society corrected the document, so it was just re-signed by the Board.

Bracht presented three change orders for the Treasurer, which approved on a motion by Bielser and second by Bainter. Carried 3-0. Two of the changes were due to one parcel being split and another was removing severed minerals.

Bainter made a motion to approve Resolution No. 19-31, setting meeting dates, payroll and warrant dates and observed holidays. Bielser seconded the motion. Carried

Dewey made a motion to approve the December 3, 2018 minutes as amended, seconded by Bainter. Carried 3-0. The warrants were approved on a motion by Dewey and second by Bielser. Carried 3-0.

Bainter discussed the Western Prairie RC & D Meeting he attended. Bielser, along with County Appraiser David Stithem, attended the KNRC meeting in Garden City. Stithem went as there were other appraisers there to talk about oil abatements and the Board of Tax Appeals (BOTA). Bracht reminded the Board that we have a regular meeting on Monday, December 17, and the last meeting of the year will be held on December 27. The Board discussed multiple county road conditions. The Board is interested in knowing how much money has been received since the County started their own recycling.

County Attorney Joe Pratt entered the meeting. Pratt reviewed with the Board Twin

Creeks information. Paulette Feldt, Road & Bridge Supervisor and Nicholas Roudybush, Mechanic, entered the meeting. Feldt distributed work maps for the prior week. Roudybush stated the transmission on truck #108 has multiple problems. He presented a bid in the amount of \$3,775 from Inland Truck Parts and Service for a remanufactured transmission with a two-year warranty. Dewey made a motion to accept the bid, seconded by Bielser. Carried 3-0. Feldt stated a couple of road and bridge employees worked over the weekend. The 4-Post Lift is here. Vitus Meier will do the wiring for it. The forklift training went well. Several questions about storing, etc. of the forklift were answered. Feldt will check on the amount that has been received for recycling since we started on

our own. Derek Dick from Kaw Valley Insurance, Inc. entered the meeting and presented health insurance information through United Healthcare. Dick talked about a separate vision policy that is available even if the County does not go with United Healthcare. Bracht will check with department heads to see if there is an interest in this benefit.

Karol Roadhouse from Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Kansas entered the meeting with the County 2019 health insurance renewal. Due to changes in number of employees, the group is moving from small group rating to large group rating. Keeping the same deductible, the increase is 5%. Increasing the deductible to \$1,200, the increase is less than 1%. Roadhouse talked about several options and reviewed changes on the different options presented. Roadhouse

exited the meeting. Kevin Coomes, Glassman Corporation, entered the meeting. Glassman again presented a bid for the Sheriff's Office. Turnkey project, natural gas forced air with heat pumps for the first and second floor of the office and dedicated AC system for IT room (mini split). They would remove the existing boiler and exposed pipes. Electrical bid from Gary Smith is included in the bid. Smith stated he talked with Clayton Follis who did not have his bid ready yet. The Commissioners will wait until the 17th to make a decision.

Dewey made a motion to accept the 2019 renewal with Blue Cross/Blue Shield for Sheridan County, the Gold Option, bumping the deductible to \$1,200. Bielser seconded the motion. Carried

The following warrants were audited and allowed: General Fund \$7,854.76 Road & Bridge \$280.09 Noxious Weed \$100.00 Public Transp. \$38.05 MV \$124.31

With no further business, Dewey made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Bielser. Motion carried 3-0. The next regular meeting will be Monday, December 17, 2018 at the regular time and meeting place.

to help me to kind of discover what my passion was. So, I'm super thankful for it now. I know that actual students there now are probably thinking the exact opposite, but it's a wonderful way to grow up."

Joanne Emerick want to know, "What other ambitions/ dreams does he have?"

Without hesitation, Nick said, "Ambition one is to be a great dad. Family is super important. So, ultimately to be able to raise a couple boys and help them find their way in the world, then grow up to be good men. That's Ambition One. The second ambition is to be a good husband. Then, it's all the dedication to the human exploration of space, and service in the Air Force. They compete and are at odds sometimes, because there's just not enough time in the day, but if I can successfully pull all that off, I'll be super happy!"

Joanne also asked, "Of what importance is the space program to our country? To the world?"

Nick stated, "The Space Station has been on orbit for 20 years. We've had somebody occupying it continuously for 18 years. Throughout that entire time, we've been conducting science; trying to push the boundaries to what we know and answer those questions we don't have answers for. Those could be about ourselves: how the humans work; diagnose diseases, cure diseases. It could be about our environment; how to be better stewards of our environment, and better understand how it operates and works. It's trying to help us just understand *more*. So, by pushing further and further into space, we're continuing to push the boundary of what we understand. Those benefits are very difficult to try to translate to 'how does the space program affect me today, right now'. There are concrete examples where you can say, 'Hey, because you work in space, you're able to do this.' Because you work in space, you have microwaves. Because you work in space, you have GPS signals to guide you. There's lots of examples. But it's not something that somebody's going to see every day, but we're out there doing it, and we've been out there doing it 18 years. It's humbling to be part of that big mission, and to make my small contribution to the long history of that. But space is important. We don't distinguish the important. When I discover something; when the scientists discover

December 31, 1930 ~ December 13, 2018

Dean L. Gawith, son of Joseph Roy and Letha Crawford Gawith, was born December 31, 1930, in Bennington, Kansas, and departed life on December 13, 2018, at Citizen's Medical Center in Colby, Kansas, surrounded by family.

Dean was raised in Minneapolis, Kansas, until 1943 when the family moved to Sharon Springs where he graduated from high school in 1949. Prior to entering the Air Force, Dean worked with his father, at the lumber yard, as a mechanic for Cecil Van Allen at John Deere in Sharon Springs, and as a section hand on the Union Pacific Railroad. In 1950, Dean's mother aided his buddies to enlist him in the Air Force. Dean served 22 months in Japan as an airplane mechanic during the Korean War.

After an honorable discharge, Dean returned to Sharon Springs to work for Cecil Van Allen and later as a parts man at International Harvester Company in Goodland. Dean married Dalene Sewell at the Dresden Methodist Church December 30, 1957. They began their married life in Goodland, then moved to the Dresden area in 1960 where he engaged in farming. They were blessed with three children: William "Bill," Donna, and Jeanette. In 1972, Dean became the postmaster in Dresden, and served until his retirement in 1999. In 2015 they moved to Colby to be closer to family.

Dean was a member of the American Legion of Jennings, the National Association of Postmasters, the Sharon Springs VFW, and Masonic Lodge of Sharon Springs. He served many years as treasurer on the Jennings Czech Memorial Museum Board.

One of the early questions asked of Hague was, "What do you look forward to most?" Nick responded, "Just getting to the Space Station!"

A common theme question among the students in the audience, and several of those received from our Facebook request, had to do with going to Mars. Nick said that going to Mars would be something for today's junior high kids. "It is their generation that will be making the first steps on Mars for the first time. They're the ones that are going to have to find the passion within themselves, and pursue their

collect up there, they find out life's dream; and hopefully, some of them are the ones making the steps, the first steps on Mars. When we're landing on Mars, I'm hopefully going to be a veteran astronaut that is helping guide the program in whatever function I can, from the ground. My days of flying will be well behind me, I'm sure."

> Nick Hague will be joined by fellow NASA classmate Christina Hammock Koch, Russian cosmonaut and Alexey Ovchinin when they launch from the Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan. They are scheduled to launch aboard a Soyuz MS12 spacecraft on February 28, 2019. During their 6-month mission in micro-gravity conditions, there will be approximately 250 research experiments and technology demonstrations performed.
